

International Experiential Learning Certificate (IELC) Requirements Fall 2014 - Summer 2015

The Beedie School of Business is pleased to provide Business Major and Business Joint Major undergraduate students the opportunity to acquire an International Experiential Learning Certificate (IELC) to be earned through a combination of international activities, language acquisition, and the study of a course related to the socio-economic and/or cultural environment in which the international activities take place.

This certificate is earned through the successful completion of 18 units which include: I) Participation in a study term abroad as an exchange student at a Beedie School of Business approved preferred partner institution

II) An international activiity - in addition to the study term abroad listed above

III) Successful completion of two 3-unit non-English second language courses, in a language commonly spoken in the region of the international activites

IV) Successful completion of a 3-unit course related to the socio-economic and/or cultural environment of the international activities.

Requirement Met

Exchange and International Experience Component One study term (at least nine units) abroad as an exchange student at a Beedie School of Business preferred partner institution. Plus one of: A second international exchange at the same or another Beedie School of Business preferred partner institution A Beedie School of Business sponsored field school An international co-operative education work term Requirement Met Language Component To increase exposure to the local culture and strengthen the student's ability to communicate in the host country's

Io increase exposure to the local culture and strengthen the student's ability to communicate in the host country's language, students are required to complete two three-unit courses* in a language(s) of the region (preferably the host country) in which the exchange, Beedie School of Business sponsored field school, or international co-operative education work term will take place. Students attending an international activity in an English-speaking country will have to select a second language that is commonly spoken in the region.
