

The SFU Beedie Degree Navigator is a course planning tool which allows students to create a term-by-term academic plan, review pre-requisites, and recommendations for program and concentration specific course sequencing.

The SFU Beedie Degree Navigator is intended to be used as a supplement to your degree planning. Course and degree planning should be done in consultation with a SFU Beedie Academic Advisor.

WHO SHOULD USE THE SFU BEEDIE DEGREE NAVIGATOR?

The SFU Beedie Degree Navigator is intended for use by students admitted to the Business Major program directly through a high school pathway in Fall 2023. If you entered into the Business program through a transfer program, you may still use the Degree Navigator as a planning tool however, please keep in mind that you will need to load your transfer courses into the degree planner manually.


HOW TO USE THE SFU DEGREE NAVIGATOR

1. SELECTING A CONCENTRATION


a) Start by selecting one or more intended concentrations from the top of the degree navigator page. You may not know which concentration you wish to pursue at this time however, selecting an intended concentration on the SFU Beedie Degree Navigator can help you see pre-requisites which you may want to prioritize. As a Business Major student, you are required to complete a minimum of one from the nine concentrations offered.

Unsure what you want to pursue?


Connect with a <u>Beedie Career Management Centre Advisor</u> to explore additional information on careers related to a specific concentration.



b) Based on which concentration(s) you select, the system will populate, term by term, the required courses and when you may want to complete them.



c) Refer to the Concentration Requirements section, which outlines additional course requirements for the concentration. Drag and drop the course over to the term and year for which you want to complete the course.




2. DETERMINING COURSE SEQUENCING AND PREREQUISITES

By clicking on a course within the term by term schedule, the following course details will be displayed on the right side of the navigator: course name, number of units, prerequisites and corequisites, a course description, and whether the course has an associated writing, quantitative or breadth requirements designation (WQB).

EXAMPLE:


By selecting BUS 251, the navigator identifies this course as being 3 units, with a prerequisite of 12 units minimum completed. It is also identified as a prerequisite requirement for BUS 254 and BUS 320, with a WQB designation of Quantitative.

In addition, the term by term schedule will highlight in red the courses requiring BUS 251 as a prerequisite. In this case BUS 322 and BUS 312 require BUS 251 and additional prerequisites. The courses requiring additional prerequisites apart from BUS 251 are marked with a red line through the course number.




3. BUILDING YOUR DEGREE

Build your ideal course plan by dragging courses around to the terms where you plan to complete them. In using BUS 251 as an example, you can see it has been moved from the Spring to the Summer term.




Mark a course as complete by clicking on the box to the left of the course in the term-by-term course schedule. Once marked complete, the navigator will include the units in the units completed box on the right panel below.

In addition, the right panel will keep a running tally of the specific degree requirements completed such as WQB courses, non-business courses, units completed, BUS 400 level courses and the international business course requirement. In the example below it shows 31 units completed and 9 out of 36 units of non-business coursework completed.



4. DOWNLOADING YOUR PROGRESS

You will not be able to save your progress, but you may generate a PDF of your proposed plan for future reference or to bring to a SFU Beedie Academic Advising session. It is recommended that you use the Business Major Checklist and the SFU Academic Calendar as resources to assist with your degree planning.
