GENERAL TIPS FOR NOMINATORS

- While nominations are submitted through Survey Monkey, we encourage you to write the nomination on another platform, like Microsoft Word, so your work is saved somewhere safe in case of an error with the website
- Nominations must absolutely meet the minimum word count to be considered for the second stage of review. Even if nominations are one word short, they will not be considered
- Run your nomination through a spelling/grammar tool to ensure there are no errors
- The Nominations should paint a full picture of the individual or group/initiative being nominated. The Adjudication Committee will not do further research to clarify elements of the nomination and the Student Engagement Office will not attempt to clarify elements during adjudication. You should assume that the nominations readers do not know the individuals or organizations being nominate
- More nominations do not equate to higher chances, we're looking for quality over quantity
- You don't have to start from scratch! Find social media posts, videos, summaries, photos, testimonials, website descriptions, or other tools that can help you start your nomination
- Use your own words. Mass produces nominations will not be considered

FOR INDIVIDUAL NOMINATIONS

THINK ABOUT...

- Who is the individual, what is their role/contribution, where do they showcase their skills, why should this individual be considered?
- How does this individual impact their peers and community?
- What learning, development, innovation, or collaboration does this individual foster?
- What skills does the individual demonstrate in their leadership or volunteer capacity?
- How did the individual impact their peers and community?
- Can you provide any numbers and facts?

FOR GROUP NOMINATIONS

THINK ABOUT...

- Who is the group, who do they serve, what is their mission and role with the community, how do they serve their mission, where do they showcase their skills, why should they be considered
- How does this group impact their peers and community (causes, groups, and communities)?
- What learning, development, innovation, or collaboration does this group foster?
- How does this group impact their peers and community?
- Can you provide any numbers and facts? Think about the number of students impacted, number of volunteers, number of external stakeholders that are connected to the experience, etc.
